Breakout sessions were interesting, though the timing of the individual papers should be coordinated/enforced to allow attendance of consecutive papers in different sessions. Also, some pairings were not well matched, i.e. the Design and Management session which featured two presentations which could hardly have been further apart on the spectrum. Finally, I realize that ESRI is a major player in our industry, but I felt like several of the breakout sessions designed to demonstrate applications of their products did not focus enough on IMAGIN-member applications but became commercials for their products. This was especially troubling as the Free GIS breakout ran at the same time as the Parcel session, preventing attendees from being able to compare and contrast potential software packages.</p>	<p>Discussions of data sharing among public sector agencies, educational institutions, and non-profit organizations.</p>
<p>Urisa talk was a big commercial for Urisa, not the ROI topic I thought we'd be getting. Sounded like a boiler plate presentation he'd given dozens of times.</p>	<p>More in the trenches type stuff. Panels and discussion groups are great.</p>

I'd like to see more speakers working with large data sets, social data sets, using interesting statistical methods, and some interest in the cartographic presentation. I would also like to see students and faculty attend IMAGIN, and consider it crucial to the continued viability of the organization. That the conference occurred during finals week was unfortunate and prohibitive.</p>

It was nice hearing a little about the formation of URISA and some of the history, but it severely outweighed the point of the talk which was ROI.	I would like to see ESRI host a panel discussion or a moderated session which allows viewers to get feedback on what other municipalities their size are doing across the region/nation. Often time smaller communities do not know what similar sized communities are doing. This could be explored during a workshop time on Tuesday afternoon.
