2. Beginning Comments from the Presidents

Scott Ambs opened the meeting with a welcome and stated that this meeting is a milestone event as both organizations have not met formally together in a long time.

Andrew Hartwick, MiCAMP President, echoed Scott's comments and added that he is looking forward to how we can work together and improve communications.

Secretaries Note for Minutes:

At the instruction of Scott Ambs, President of IMAGIN, these minutes are being presented as a summary of overall discussion topics and are not intended to reflect the normal course of business at a regular IMAGIN Board Meeting. As such, these minutes attempt to record the main topic points of the discussions held during the meeting.

Discussion Topics:

3. Strengths of Having Two Organizations

- 3.1. Two conferences allow different groups of people to participate and enjoy conferences instead of always working
- 3.2. Two events keep GIS out there in front of public
- 3.3. Work to coordinate unified goals to eliminate some duplication of effort
- 3.4. Take two sides of a discussion and debate effectively in an open forum
 - 3.4.1. Second opinion for state when they request a position
- 3.5. Groups appeal to two different constituencies / populations
- 3.6. Develop common sets of goals regarding GIS objectives for State of Michigan
 - 3.6.1. Developing a two organization unified voice will help push implementation of GIS goals
- 3.7. Combining energies to tackle bigger issues
 - 3.7.1. Examples: Funding, current issues, mandates
- 3.8. Conference tracks allow us to bring in other groups that use GIS to learning core principles
- 3.9. Seeing a broader pictures of GIS uses and functionality

4. Weaknesses of Having Two Organizations

- 4.1. Financial constraints of supporting two organizations
- 4.2. Perception of animosity between groups
- 4.3. Perception of no unified voice in front of the State of Michigan
- 4.4. Really there are three (3) groups, not two (2) – IMAGIN, MiCAMP, State of Michigan
 - 4.4.1. Multiple groups affects the ability to influence legislation
- 4.5. Sifting of the GIS users community: The groups are not good at leveraging other groups who have GIS interests also. GIS has disseminated into other organizations / departments.
- 4.6. Decision makers don't know what GIS does. Educating the benefits of GIS staff.
- 4.7. Difficulty filling board vacancies and other committees and teams

5. Opportunities for Organizations to Work Together

- 5.1. Meet jointly one (1) or two (2) times a year as a joint group to develop goals for the year. Keep both organizations abreast of legislation activity at the State.
- 5.2. Education of decision makers is still needed
- 5.3. Representation of members at each groups conference
- 5.4. Pick a topic and form joint committee to tackle the issue
 - 5.4.1. Concept of a legislative action committee
- 5.5. Educational opportunities – leverage other organizations
- 5.6. Present at each other's conference / meetings
- 5.7. Promote success stories
- 5.8. Leverage state resources for IMAGIN / MiCAMP educational opportunities and events
- 5.9. Encourage membership in a group and become more involved (promotion)
- 5.10. Promote scholarships in other avenues
- 5.11. Re-energize existing groups and structures

6. Where Do We Go

- 6.1. Meet together two (2) times a year after conferences
- 6.2. Legislative reviews
- 6.3. Leverage State List-Serve more – Use to promote events
- 6.4. Dual memberships between organizations
- 6.5. Keep hot topics from one conference to the next
- 6.6. Increase each other's presence at both conferences
- 6.7. Develop joint presentations at universities to bridge the professional / educational gap
- 6.8. Jointly promote both organizations scholarship opportunities
- 6.9. Promote IMAGIN/MiCAMP unity
